

As We Gather

Fears abound this Christmas. It is true for us today as we consider the problems in our world and the difficulties and stresses that daily life brings our way. Fears were also present that first Christmas, when the shocked shepherds were visited by the heavenly host and the glory of the Lord shone around them. "Fear not!" the angels proclaimed. The shepherds did not need to be filled with fear at God's presence, for the purpose of the angels' visit was to announce to them the news that would change the world: "For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11).
