
Circumcision of Our Lord January 1, 2023

Divine Service, Setting Two

As We Gather

A new year begins! Yet, often so little changes. For most, a new year means little difference regarding life, vocation, house, and home. Outside of annually changing one number on our calendar, much of life remains the same, including the daily battles we face against Satan, sin, and our own flesh. 



Sermon The Law Fulfilled

Nicene Creed

- C hear our prayer.


