Divine Service, Setting Three

As We Gather

Our Lord says the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who goes out to hire laborers for his vineyard. The kingdom of heaven, then, requires work. It shouldn't surprise us, because the first task of man in Paradise was to tend to a garden. In the Gospel for Septuagesima, Our Lord indicates to us that the kingdom of heaven in which we are called to labor is not so different. The Prophecy from Daniel outlines for us what this discipline will be: prayer, fasting, and repentance. If we are to observe a holy Lent, we can't stumble into it at the last moment, unawares and taken by surprise, but must take these weeks to prepare ourselves, identifying those things in our lives which stand as obstacles in the way of the life of Christ being manifest in us, and planning for how we will seek, by prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, to overcome them.
