#### As We Gather

Elijah called to the Lord for the life of a widow's son, and the Lord delivered him from death. Jesus met another widow at a funeral procession, and death gave up one more victim to the power of His Word. Paul told the story of his own transformation from death to life by the Gospel. This same transforming power is at work in us who were dead in our sin but now are alive to God in Christ. Let us live this new life so that we display the power of God that has saved us in our words and works.



# Welcome to our Visitors


