As We Gather

In the Small Catechism, we are reminded that the summary of the first three Commandments, the First Table, are found in the words of Jesus we hear today: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind," and Commandments 4–10, the Second Table, is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37, 39). The summary of all the Commandments is love, as "Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law" (Romans 13:10). So often, though, we realize our love for God and love for others is imperfect and falls short of every command from our holy Lord. Yet, even in our fallen condition, we are shown and given a perfect love that remains through the giving of His own Son, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Claimed as His own and forgiven, we then live under the grace of His cross and empty tomb, that we are by faith empowered to love as He has first loved us.
