

Lutheran Service Book: Concordance contains an alphabetical listing of key words in the texts of the hymnal. Although it might seem to be structured for church professionals choosing hymns for services, it has value for all people in the church. Paging through the book, it is easy to discover what words are frequently repeated in hymns—words that are important to singers of Christian songs. Among frequently repeated words are "eternal," "forever," "everlasting," "endless," "eternally," and "eternity." There is no time limit to the relationship God has with His faithful people. 



Prayer of the Church


P Let us pray for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.




